[No Turning Back](#) has been a Bluegrass Gospel Ministry for about 15 years, led by Paul Stimson -- the only original member.

Larry Joyner joined Paul in the band about 8 years ago followed Barbara Fuller who has been with the group over past two years. Paul said the group has a banjo player, Kim Longenbaugh, who joined them and has played with them now for two months.

Paul said, "All we play, on stage, is Gospel. We sponsor an all Bluegrass, (not all Gospel) show. That show is held on the 3rd Friday of each month, (except December), at the Lillian First Baptist Church. We have put on that show for about 13 years." Lillian is an unincorporated community in Johnson County located along Farm to Market Road 2738, approximately fifteen miles northeast of Cleburne and about 25 miles south of Fort Worth, Texas.

## Knock Out Roses

### Consider Donating Today

In 2000, Knock Out Roses were introduced to rave reviews. Their creator, William Radler of Wisconsin, worked many years to develop a premiere disease-resistant rose. Knock Out roses are the result and are, indeed, extremely disease-resistant in addition to being quite easy to maintain and simply gorgeous. The stunning reds of this newcomer were an instant hit with rose gardeners. Taking a coveted All-American Rose Selection award in 2000, Knock Out roses offered the total package. Today, they rank near the top in popularity, as growers and nurseries work to keep up with demand.

Knock Out roses are hardy shrub plants that typically grow to a height of 3 feet and approximately the same width. Their blooms grow in clusters of brilliant variations of pinks and reds, consistently blooming from spring until fall. Properly pruned and cared for, Knock Out roses are considered winter hardy plants that come back easily the next spring.

As a result of their uniform growth as shrubs, Knock Out roses can work effectively for seasonal hedges and borders, along with select evergreens to balance their wintering season. But their greatest benefit is a resistance to disease, which can devastate many roses.
